# Olympic Torch & Diamond Jubilee

On the 30th May 2012, the villagers of Gnosall took to the streets to welcome the Olympic Torch Relay through our village. The streets were lined with flags, red white and blue bunting and people waiting with anticipation for the convoy to ascend on Gnosall. A number of runners held the Torch along the A518 with crowds cheering as they passed with perfect once in a lifetime photo opportunities. Local volunteers were stewards, enforcing road closures and keeping the crowds under control. Despite the rain, St. Lawrence School arranged a Village Picnic on the Thursday 31st, inviting friends and family from around the village to come together as a community. A display of memorabilia celebrating the Queen's Coronation was well attended at St. Lawrence Church during the week with many interesting and rare artefacts on display. A traditional tea party was hosted by the Gnosall Brownies at the Memorial Village Hall and the more senior and less able residents in the village were invited. This was a wonderful event which was enjoyed by all and entertainment was provided by Gnosall Players. On Sunday 3rd, a service of celebration was held at St. Lawrence Church followed by some residents having old-fashioned street parties commemorating the Jubilee.











#### The Acres

There have been huge changes on the Acres with the completion of the first phase of the Regeneration Project. This includes work to start restoring the Doley Brook and a series of pools created. To provide more security for the allotments, new fencing has been installed and a hedgerow planted by St. Lawrence School pupils. A new footpath now links the allotments and Brookhouse Road playground car parks – including over 300m of boardwalk across the boggy floodplain. We apologise for any inconvenience caused by the route's closure during the excessive flooding this summer. The new path was officially opened in May, when the


this £90,000 project possible. We have had some wonderful feedback from local people - particularly regarding the boardwalk & new benches. To respect other users and reduce disturbance to the pools, the Parish Council ask all dog-walkers to keep their pets on close leads on the boardwalk. We intend extending handrails to other sections of the boardwalk in the next phase of the project. Work on fundraising has already started for this phase, which we hope will see further enhancement of facilities, wildlife habitats, community initiatives and linking paths to external routes.

# <u>Finger Post Project</u>

In 2011, following comments received from Moreton residents, the Parish Council identified 4 finger posts that were dilapidated and in need of replacement. Therefore, money was put aside in this years' budget to replace the posts. Proposals for new signs receive positive feedback from residents. This is an on-going project which will be completed within the near future.

# Village Green

The piece of land next to the medical centre, on Brookhouse Road, now belongs to the Parish Council after it was gifted to us from Taylor Wimpey. The land was granted village green status in 2010. Obviously the land comes with ongoing maintenance costs which the Parish Council now has to find from its budget. The Parish Council has applied for funds from Queen Elizabeth II Playing Fields Association and also from Staffordshire Environmental Fund. The Parish Council will create a working group with local organisations who are able to volunteer some time. They will also attend meetings to focus on developing this piece of land into a simple, low maintenance open space for parishioners to enjoy.
